HIGHLIGHTS OF THE EVENT

- Comprehensive Cancer Screenings: Over 20 members of the transgender and transmen community participated in the camp, receiving comprehensive cancer screenings. The focus was on early detection of various types of cancer.
- Expert Medical Team: In addition to screenings, the camp featured educational sessions on cancer prevention, early signs and symptoms, and the importance of regular health check-ups.
- Community Engagement: The camp received overwhelming support from local community leaders and organizations. Their involvement was crucial in mobilizing participants.
- Follow-Up and Support: Participants who required further medical attention were provided with referrals to hospitals and clinics for follow-up care.
